It is your professional responsibility to know the legal requirements governing the practice of your profession and be alert to changes in those requirements.

Article 22

The examination on Article 22 contains twelve multiple-choice questions. Read each of the following questions and circle the best answer.

1. Through Article 22, the State of North Carolina provides regulatory authority over persons offering audiology service to the public to:
 - a. Safeguard the public health, safety and welfare
 - b. Protect the public from being misled by incompetent, unscrupulous, and unauthorized persons
 - c. Protect the public from unprofessional conduct

2. Students pursuing a graduate degree in audiology:
 - a. Are not required to hold a license
 - b. Must identify themselves as students
 - c. May not refer to themselves as an audiologist

3. The North Carolina Board of Examiners for Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists:
